

Recycling DOs

Empty. Clean. Dry. Loose. All Recyclables in one bin.

Use a plastic Spatula and water for removing food contaminants from plastic containers & glass jars.



Recycling



1) DON'T Recycle Plastic Bags or Plastic Film

We do not accept film plastic, shrink wrap, or bubble wrap.

- 2) DON'T Recycle Materials in Plastic Bags Place recyclables directly in your cart in save time. The only exception is for shredded paper.
- 3) DON'T Recycle Rope-Like Items Do not include water hoses, belts, holiday lights, etc as they can wrap around machines.
- 4) DON'T Recycle Loose Shredded Paper Secure shredded paper in a bag, otherwise the pieces may blow out of trucks.
- 5) DON'T Recycle Styrofoam or Product Packaging Plastic lids, Styrofoam, packing peanuts, cups and coolers are currently not recyclable.
- DON'T Recycle Liquids Please completely empty and quickly rinse out all containers before recycling.
- 7) DON'T Recycle Glass or Ceramics We do not accept glass, ceramic, china, dishes, mirrors, light bubs, or window glass.
- 8) DON'T Recycle Diapers or Bio-Hazardous Waste Syringes and needles, diapers and other sanitary products are not recyclable.
- 9) DON'T Recycle Hazardous Waste or Electronics Paint, automotive fluids, batteries, and pesticides must be disposed of in a specialized way
- 10) DON'T Recycle Scrap Metal or Automotive Parts Scrap metal of any size, including metal hangers, should not go in your curbside cart
- 11) DON'T Recycle Frozen Food Boxes or Waxed Cardboard Frozen pizza and entrées, juice boxes and milk cartons are not recyclable because they have a plastic polymer sprayed on them to protect against freezer burn.
- 12) DON'T Recycle Food Contaminated Items Cardboard or plastic like pizza boxes that contain irremovable food waste, such as grease, should not be placed in the recycling cart.

(No need to remove: paper clips, stamps, address labelogical) staples, etc)

White/Pastel Office Paper File Folders Opened Mail & Greeting Cards Paperback books Phone Books Magazines, brochures, & Catalogs Paper egg cartons Paper Bags Paperboard boxes Newspapers & Inserts (no bags)



2) DO Recycle Cardboard

Corrugated Cardboard, Flattened



3) DO Recycle Plastic Containers

#1-7 Plastic Tubs Bottles Jugs Lids



4) DO Recycle Metal

Metal Cans Soda Cans Clean, balled aluminum foil (2" or larger) Pie pans
